I hope during my time with the Atlanta FSC we can win a bid to host either Regionals, Sectionals or Nationals. That would be another wonderful feather in our Club's hat! I was also the chair of Lighting and Set Up and Take Down for our "Georgia On My Mind" spring show. The show was so challenging because I knew nothing about lighting or wireless communications! Please describe your accomplishments and goals as a skater.

It was about the only time we really got to see any coverage of the sport, unlike today. My father was a swimming and diving coach so I spent most of my time growing up at the pool. I swam competitively for years, played water polo and was a life guard. What a contrast between figure skating and swimming. In one sport you have a whole sheet of ice, music and choreography. In the other, you go up and down the pool in one lane and repeat thousands of times.

Why do you stay involved as a volunteer with the Atlanta FSC?

The biggest reason I stay involved with the Atlanta FSC is to support the young skaters, the club and the sport.
