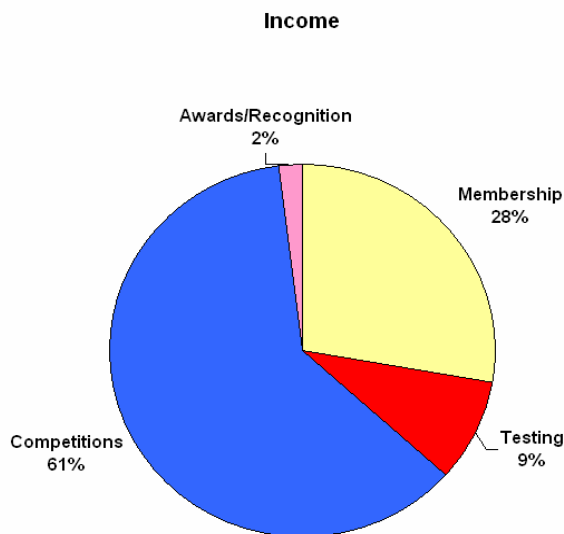

2010-2011 Atlanta FSC Operating Budget Allocations

Just like any non-profit organization, the Atlanta FSC develops an annual budget based on projected income and expenses. Our zero-based approach relies on the estimates of various committee chairs and is adjusted to ensure that the budget is fiscally responsible. The Board of Directors is charged with financial stewardship that benefits the entire membership.

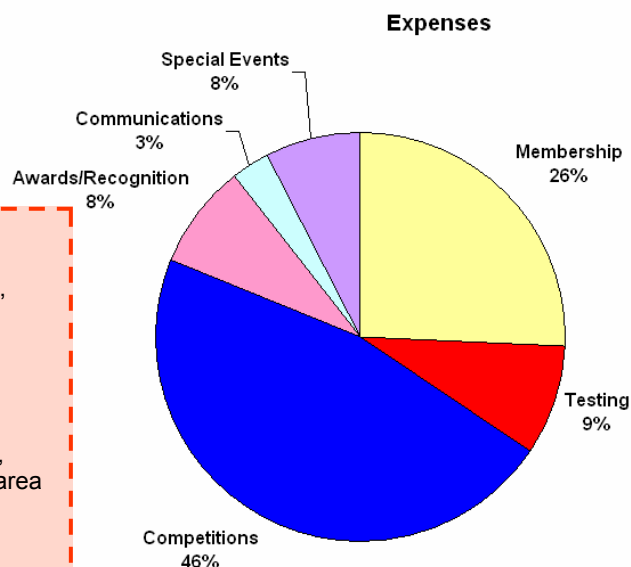


Income is sourced from four main categories: the annual Magnolia Open and Atlanta Open competitions, membership dues, testing fees, and the annual awards banquet.

Profits from these events fund special events, awards and recognition, communications, and skater financial assistance as well as monthly fees for the storage facility, insurance, bank fees, and the post office box rental.

Tim Dolensky's IceNetwork
 Interview At Liberty



Atlanta's Timothy Dolensky is forming an annual tradition: each birthday brings a new Liberty title. Last season, the U.S. novice bronze medalist, who turned 18 on Sunday, treated himself to a win in Liberty's novice event. This year, the Atlanta skater -- who is coached by Debbie Prachar and Brittney Bottoms -- won juniors with an elegant free to "Warsaw Concerto."

Dolensky recovered from a shaky start, doubling his second jump, an intended triple Lutz, but came back strong in the second half with four other triples, two in combination. "I thought it was pretty good," Dolensky said. "Of course, I made mistakes in the beginning, but I tried to put them behind me and skate rest of program."

Dolensky's program component score, 52.16, was by far the highest of the junior men.

"I've grown a lot in maturity; I'm trying hard to get into the music more and finish all the moves I am doing, instead of just throwing an arm up," he said.

Sound I dislike: The sound of someone chewing gum, ewww

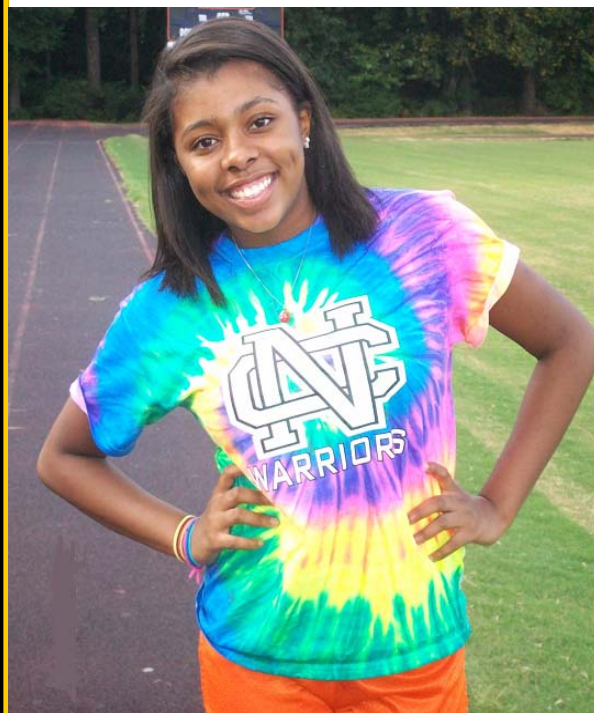
I would never want to be: A dentist, because I get nauseated when I see people brush their teeth.

2011 Academic Scholarship Revised Requirements

This year the club academic scholarship requirements have changed to eliminate a commitment to future figure skating involvement and to expand past and current volunteer requirements to include both figure skating and community service.

The scholarship is available to all Atlanta FSC members in good standing who have been full members for at least two consecutive years and who are/will be full-time students pursuing a degree at an accredited four-year college/university, junior or community college, or graduate school. Academically, the applicant must have achieved a 3.0 GPA (on a 4.0 scale) or 3.75 (on a 5.0 scale).

In 2011, a maximum of four grants of varying denominations, but no less than \$500, may be awarded. The maximum individual grant is \$1,000.

The application will be posted online in the next few weeks. The deadline is **April 11, 2011.**

A Role Model On and Off the Ice

(Judge, Board Member, Competitions Committee Chair, and much more!)

Multi-talented, energetic, and creative aptly describe one of our most prolific volunteers – Jeannette Doney. Both on and off the ice, Jeannette displays a passion for figure skating that, combined with her professionalism, enables her to serve as a terrific role model to our adult and junior members. During the past decade, Jeannette has cheerfully served in significant leadership positions..

For her continued dedication and service across so many areas, the Atlanta FSC gratefully acknowledges her as our feature volunteer for September.

When did you join the Atlanta FSC, and how did you first become involved as a volunteer?

I joined the Atlanta FSC on my birthday in 1998 in order to submit my application for my first Pre-Preliminary MIF test later that same month. I remember serving as Ice Monitor Chair early on, but I really became involved in the club after investigating the possibility of becoming a judge. Initially I saw that as a way to help me learn more about the rules and requirements, and hopefully further my own on-ice skills, but it quickly developed into a passion.

Describe your past and current positions, as well as any other contributions to the club.

*I was recently elected to a 2-year term on the BOD, and I also served on the Board from 2005-2007, during which time my duties included Editor of the **Freestyler**. I've Co-Chaired the Magnolia Open 3 times (in 2005, 2008 and 2010), and have been invited to judge every Magnolia and Atlanta Open since 2001. In addition to test sessions too numerous to count, I've also cooperated with coaches to judge quite a few Pre-Preliminary and Preliminary tests on morning freestyle sessions at both The Cooler and The MIC. Additionally, I assist with IJS system set-up and testing, and put my A/V crew talents to work on numerous occasions – such as producing the 50th Anniversary DVD, Award Banquet slide presentations, and cutting music CDs for club special events. This year I am serving as Competitions Chair and will continue as a Trial Judge Monitor.*

Describe your accomplishments and goals as a skater.

I literally started in a Basic Skills class when The Cooler first opened, and am currently an Adult Silver level skater working on my Gold MIF test. My proudest accomplishments are a Silver medal in free skating at Adult Nationals, and two National gold medals in interpretive. I've always joked that I wanted to be finished working on anything with the word "Juvenile" in it by the time I reach 60, but my most consistent goal has always been to just try to make everything I do a little bit better and never settle for "good enough".

Why do you stay involved as a volunteer with the Atlanta FSC?

There is nothing more personally satisfying than having the opportunity to do things you truly enjoy and which helps others in areas they would not necessarily have the time or training to do. You get to meet some truly amazing people along the way, and the food is awesome too (thanks hospitality)!
