

### 2019 Atlanta Open Named NQS and NSDS Competition



We are so excited to announce that The 2019 Atlanta Open has been approved as a participating competition within the **National Qualifying Series** for both Singles and Pairs! We are also a participating competition within the **National Solo Dance Competition Series**.



The purpose of the NQS is to allow athletes at the qualifying levels (Juvenile - Senior) to earn an official national series ranking, a sectional ranking, and can earn a bye/automatic advance through their first level of the qualifying competition structure. Athletes may compete in any NQS events in any geographic location. Only the skater's highest score will count toward their final national and sectional ranking and for earning a

Bye, and only the top six singles competitors in each section will earn a bye to their Sectionals Singles Final. Please refer to Page 3 for full details. If you do NOT wish to participate in the NQS, you may still compete in these events; scores will not count toward the Series.

#### Registration

Skaters who wish to participate in the NQS must first register with U.S. Figure Skating, via EMS, by May 28 and pay an administrative entry fee of \$25.00. Registration for the series will open on April 15; Late entries will not be permitted. Athletes must register separately via EMS for each competition they wish to enter. The Atlanta Open announcement will be available soon!

#### **NATIONAL QUALIFYING SERIES**

#### **QUALIFYING COMPETITIVE PIPELINE**

Beginning with the 2019-20 competitive season, there will be a new competitive pipeline for singles, pairs and dance athletes focused on the vision: Identify. Develop. Promote.

The pipeline features the following:

- NEW! National Qualifying Series
- New names for qualifying competitions
- Additional athletes qualifying for the sectional singles challenge
- Earlier timeline for pairs and dance teams and another opportunity for national competition
- National High-Performance Development Team Camp for juvenile, intermediate and novice athletes

#### **NATIONAL QUALIFYING SERIES**

The National Qualifying Series (NQS) is a series of official U.S. Figure Skating approved competitions hosted individually by member clubs nationwide that are held in a standard format and in which athletes earn official scores towards a sectional and national rank. The competitions are held between June 1 – September 15 and serve juvenile – senior competitors in singles, dance and pairs.

#### Key highlights:

- Athletes must enter the NQS directly with U.S. Figure Skating by May 28, 2019
- Athletes enter any official competitions they choose
- Only the athlete or team's highest Total Score (TS) counts
- The top six ranking singles athletes in each section earn a bye to the Sectional Singles Final
- The top three ranking dance or pairs teams nationwide earn a bye the U.S. Pairs or U.S. Dance Final
- Athletes receive an official 'national ranking' and a certificate and pin to recognize their achievement.

#### **INFORMATION FOR ATHLETES**

The list of official NQS competitions will be posted no later than March 4. Athletes must enter the overall NQS by May 28, 2019 – competitions are entered separately, by the specific entry deadline. Athletes do NOT need to select their competitions at the time of registration. Athletes may also "skate up" one test level and may enter two competitive levels.

### Standardized Testing of Athleticism to Recognize Skaters (S.T.A.R.S.)

evaluates your athleticism in areas important to skating performance and helps identify areas needing improvement. The S.T.A.R.S. combine includes a

- Dynamic Warm-Up Class
- Sports Science Seminar
- · Detailed Athlete Report

### High Performance Movement Screen (HPMS)

evaluates your ability to move your body in ways fundamental to skating technique, and measures your mobility, stability, symmetry and balance. Participants receive a

- Detailed Athlete Report
- Video-based feedback for corrective exercises

S.T.A.R.S. is open to U.S. Figure Skating athletes ages 6 and up who have passed pre-preliminary moves.

HPMS is open to U.S. Figure Skating athletes who have passed juvenile moves in the field, and to adult skaters.

S.T.A.R.S. (Standardized Testing of Athleticism to Recognize Skaters) is a oneday event consisting of 15 off-ice tests meant to evaluate developing athletes in three

- Agility, balance and coordinationStrength and power
- Flexibility

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

- Minimum age: six years at the date of the combine; current USFS member
- Passed Pre-Preliminary MITF for S.T.A.R.S. portion and Juvenile MITF for the High Performance Movement Screen; adult skaters who have passed Pre-Bronze MITF for HPMS

#### REPORTS

- Raw test scores along with comparison data that shows how their peers scored by skating level (test day); no individual date shared
- Comprehensive results report comparing each athlete to his/her peers by age and gender (end of season)

#### COST

- Combine Only: \$64 Includes assessment, dynamic warm-up class, personalized results report, an athlete t-shirt and a S.T.A.R.S. seminar
- Combine + High Performance Movement Screen: \$149.00. Includes S.T.A.R.S. Assessment, dynamic warmup class, sports science seminar, detailed S.T.A.R.S. athlete report, detailed HPMS report along with feed back and exercise prescription and athlete gift







Tim executed a double Axel, six triple jumps (three in combination) for a free skate score of 147.84 and a final competition score of 228.94. He was selected as alternate for both the 2019 World Championships and the 2019 Four Continents competition.

Breelie and Tyler garnered a pattern dance score of 34.94 and a free dance score of 49.02 for a total competition score of 83.96.

#### What famous person would you most like to meet?


I would love to meet the singer Lauren Daigle because she is an inspiration to me and my music.
