I. COMPETITION OVERVIEW

The Non-Qualifying Atlanta Open Competition will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the <u>current rulebook</u>, as well as any pertinent updates that have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating <u>website</u>.

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules.

Skaters must be a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, a collegiate club or who is an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. For non-U.S. citizens, please refer to the rulebook for more information.

National Qualifying Series

This competition has been approved as a National Qualifying Series (NQS) event.
 Phased registration for Juvenile – Senior will be managed separately on EMS, click here for additional information.

II. ELIGIBILITY

TEST LEVEL:

As of December 1, 2022, singles athletes may opt to accelerate their test progression within U.S. Figure Skating and thus compete at level(s) best suited for their technical skillset. Athletes must still meet the minimum requirements for each level and additionally, if participating within the National Qualifying Series (NQS) or National Excel Series (Excel), they will establish a <u>competitive floor</u>.

The <u>competitive floor</u> is the lowest level an athlete can compete at and is determined only by the level selected through the EMS Series Application for NQS or Excel and is not uniquely tied to competition registration (regardless of series participation).

Eligibility Notes:

- 1. If an athlete participates in BOTH Excel and NQS, their NQS level may be ONE lower than their Excel level. For example, if an athlete skates Junior Excel, they may skate Novice NQS.
- 2. The singles free skate test levels will remain as a minimum requirement to compete.
- 3. Athletes may not skate down in any event.
- 4. This update does NOT apply to Adult, Showcase and Solo Dance.

Age restrictions/requirements:

Singles free skate events (well-balanced program) have the following requirements:

Open Pre-Juvenile: Girls - 13 years or older; Boys - 14 years or older Pre-Juvenile: Girls - 12 years or younger; Boys - 13 years or younger Juvenile: Girls - 12 years or younger; Boys - 13 years or younger Open Juvenile: Girls - 13 years or older; Boys - 14 years or older

Intermediate must be under the age of 18



Adults must be 21 years or older

Skaters entering pre-juvenile and lower events will be divided as closely as possible by age should the number of entries warrant more than one group.

COACHES

To be an eligible coach at a nonqualifying competition, coaches must meet the applicable compliance requirements and verified by U.S. Figure Skating. Coach compliance falls into three categories, Coach/Choreographer, Learn to Skate USA Instructor, or Foreign Coach/Choreographer. Details regarding compliance requirements can be found <u>HERE</u>. All compliance requirements must be met at the time of check-in to access the competition, no exceptions.

III. REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Entries will be accepted via EMS at https://m.usfigureskating.org with credit card only. Each transaction will include a 3% credit card fee. Online registration open on June 22nd, 2023 at 12:00 pm (noon) ET and closes on July 24th at 11:59 PM ET. The LOC reserves the right to close registration early in the event we have reached maximum skater capacity. Skaters wishing to register for the competition will need their US Figure Skating member number and password.

EMS MUSIC UPLOAD: Competitors participating in events with music are required to upload their music to EMS no later than **August 10th**, **2023 at 6:00 PM ET**.. After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature and subject to a **\$25.00 late fee**. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite.

Competitors must also have available a backup copy of their competition music on a cell phone and it must be immediately available rink side whenever the skater competes. If the phone does not have the standard round headset connector, an appropriate adapter, such as an Apple Lightning connector or Samsung USB-C adapter is required to be attached. The phone should be presented to the music person with the file ready to play, phone in airplane mode and volume turned to maximum.

All music must meet the following criteria. If you have questions about what format you have, please contact your coach and get a new version of your music that meets the criteria listed below.

Music Criteria:

- -File Format: MP3
- -Bit Rate 192 kbps or higher and Sample Rate 44,100 kHz
- -This will be verified by the music chair and they may request you upload a corrected file -Leaders and trailers (the silence or "dead space" before and after the actual start and end of the Program music) may not exceed 2 seconds. We prefer that there be NO leaders or trailers at all. Excessive leaders and trailers may disrupt the playing of the music during competition.

Back Up Copy:

Competitors must also bring a copy of their competition music on CD as a backup in case of technical difficulties and must be available rink side during the competitions. Only CDs (standard CD-R format only) will be accepted for backups and must clearly be marked with competitor's name, event and running time. Only 1 track per CD is allowed.

EMS PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT (PPC) — Competitors participating in IJS events are required to submit PPC in EMS no later than August 10th, 2023 at 6:00 PM EASTERN. After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature in EMS and subject to a \$25.00 late fee. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite.

REFUND POLICY

Entry fees will not be refunded after entry deadline under any circumstances unless the 2023 Atlanta Open is cancelled. There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals. Payments of any fees will be required before the skater is allowed to participate in practice ice or events.

JUDGING SYSTEMS:

IJS: The International Judging System (IJS) will be used for the following events: Excel Freeskate Pre-Preliminary- Senior, Well Balanced Singles NO Test to Juvenile, Adult Pre-Bronze-Masters Jr/Sr Free Skate, Short Programs Open Juvenile and Juvenile.

6.0: The 6.0 Majority Judging System will be used for Excel Free Skate Beginner to High Beginner, Adult Beginner and High Beginner, Compulsory Moves, Jumps Challenge, Spins Challenge.

Judging systems have been specified in the chart of offered events later in the announcement. In case links to event requirements conflict with the latest UFSF registration, the current (latest) rulebook requirements will be followed.

IV. COMPETITION DETAILS

FACILITIES:

The Cooler

The two ice surfaces measure 200' x 85' with rounded corners and hockey barriers. The Cooler has locker rooms and an on-site restaurant/bar and snack bar. Due to Covid-19 pandemic, the facility will not offer locker rooms and the restaurant has limited opening hours.

LOCKER ROOMS AND CHANGING AREAS:

Locker rooms and changing areas will not be available this competition. All athletes are expected to arrive at the arena ready (costumes, hair, make-up etc.). Athletes will be provided with an area to put skates on but changing will not be permitted in these spaces.

In case locker room use is allowed, the rooms and changing areas at US Figure Skating competitive events are for athletes only, will be labeled with regard to specific use where identified will be gender specific. An exception can be made for athletes 11 years old and younger that will allow for one parent of the same gender to assist their child immediately prior to and after their skating event(s). Preview the Locker Room and Changing Area Policy and the USFS Skate Safe Handbook (both found on the U.S.



Figure Skating SkateSafe page). Any use of electronic devices or smart phones must be avoided and absolutely no photo/videography is allowed inside locker rooms.

U.S. Figure Skating Travel Policy:

All travel must strictly adhere to Two-Deep Leadership requirements. An Adult Participant cannot transport a Minor Athlete one-on-one and Two-Deep Leadership requirements must be adhered to at all times during In-Program travel, by transporting at least two minors or a second Adult Participant. An Adult Participant cannot share a hotel room or other sleeping arrangement with a Minor Athlete(s). Full details of the SkateSafe Travel Policy and any exceptions can be found starting on page 12 of the SkateSafe Handbook.

OFFICIAL WEBSITE & UPDATES:

An official bulletin board will be maintained of the Atlanta Figure Skating Club website as Virtual Program. All starting orders and results will be posted online only. Link to this information will be provided for each attendee.

It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent and coach to check the bulletin board frequently for any schedule changes and/or additional information pertaining to the competition.

Skaters are requested to arrive <u>60 minutes</u>, <u>(1 hour)</u> prior to the scheduled time of their event. A tentative schedule of events will be posted prior to the competition. Events may run up to 30 minutes early at the discretion of the Chief Referee.

SCHEDULE

Competitors may be scheduled on any day or time during the announced dates of the competition. The competition and practice ice schedule will be available after the close of entries. All participants will be notified via email once available.

EMS PRACTICE ICE:

Pre-Purchase opening June 22nd, 2023 at 12:00 pm (noon) ET, closes day after registration. **Selection Opening & Open Sales** Please follow Practice Ice Timeline available in EMS by selecting the Atlanta Open Competition, then Information tab, then the Practice Ice Prices & Timeline.

Sales: We will sell practice ice sessions in advance (pre-purchase during registration window, click practice ice button on EMS Competition Portal after you have completed registration. After the schedule of competition is published, skaters may select pre —purchased session. After selection window closes we will open additional open practice ice sales. All practice ice will be available for purchase online only through the EMS Competition Portal. A timeline for practice ice sales periods will be available for viewing on the competition information page of your EMS Competition Portal. Athletes will be notified about the practice ice selection starting/ending times and additional practice ice sales openings via email. All skaters are encouraged to purchase practice ice through EMS on their mobile devices/computers and sales will remain live through the competition depending on ice availability.

Unofficial Practice Ice: Please note that all practice ice will be Unofficial Practice Ice and no music will be played during sessions.

Earbud/headphones: Earbuds and wireless headphones/other music devices will not be allowed on practice sessions or warm ups associated with any events in this competition.

PHOTO/VIDEO: Professional Video will be provided to each skater by Pro-Mix Sound & Video for full ice events and is included in the cost of registration. Photography sales services will be provided during the competition. Event will not be live streamed as spectators will be allowed in the building. In case this changes, attendees will be notified of possible changes. Attendees will be notified about the vendor later. Event photography is not included in the entry fee.

For the safety and welfare of the skater, personal photography and videography will be permitted in the stands only and is restricted to hand-held/battery operated equipment (no tripods). Flash photography is strictly prohibited in the ice arenas and stands. No one will be permitted to obstruct the view of other seated spectators by standing in front of or hanging over the plexi-glass barriers or to film at alternative ice entrances. In order to comply with local fire safety codes, all aisles within the stands must also remain clear. Non-compliance with this policy or refusal to comply immediately with requests from event officials will result in the violator being escorted out of the rink.

Note, per US Figure Skating policy, photography and/or recording of anyone other than your own skater is strictly prohibited as stated in the Basic Ice Usage and Skater Etiquette Information document found in the Club Resource section of Member's Only on USFS website.

ONSITE CHECK-IN:

Registration will open on August 25th, 2023 as practice ice sessions begin and close at the completion of the final event of the competition. The registration table will be clearly marked and located adjacent to the entrance of the rink. Please be prepared to a possible health check outside the arena prior to entering the facility and social distancing from attendees including athletes, spectators, officials, coaches and volunteers depending on current health situation.

By registering to this event attendees acknowledge the policies and agree following them. All skaters are also required to sign waivers by US Figure Skating through EMS registration. Health check - in case conducted can include temperature measuring from exposed forehead and responding to survey questions. Currently these processes are not conducted. Please register promptly upon arrival. Prepare arriving approximately 1 hour prior to your event start time. Events may run up to 30 minutes early at the discretion of the Chief Referee.

AWARDS:

Medals will be presented to the 1^{st} , 2^{nd} , 3^{rd} , and 4^{th} , place winners in each competition event. Each singles event will be awarded separately.

Award ceremonies will be conducted approximately 20 minutes after event results are official. Award podium will be in the lobby area. Modifications may occur depending on the covid-19 risk level. In case



health regulations require, ceremonies will be withheld, and medals can be retrieved from the registration desk.

TEST CREDIT:

Skaters meeting the requirements for test credit may request their test credit forms at registration prior to the start of their event (Open Juvenile- Juvenile through Senior, Adult Silver- Masters Jr/Sr only). This must be requested on-site. Test credit will not be available after the last IJS event has ended and the competition has concluded. Please make the request at the registration desk no later than 1 hour after your events conclusion. Forms must be picked up at the registration desk prior to the end of the competition. A fee of \$25 will be charged to non-Atlanta FSC members.

VOLUNTEER INFO:

Atlanta Figure Skating Club require Full Skating and Adult members to offer 8 hours (Bridge Members 4 hours) volunteering for club events. Food donations do not count as volunteer hours but are greatly appreciated. Please look for online sign up opportunities prior to the event.
